New Website and Training for NH Coastal Viewer Mapping Tool

New Hampshire GRANIT and the NHDES Coastal Program are excited to launch a new website and training program for the New Hampshire Coastal Viewer mapping tool: www.nhcoastalviewer.org. The NH Coastal Viewer, which first launched in 2015, is a web-based mapping tool that makes spatial datasets about community assets, natural resources, and hazards within New Hampshire's 42 coastal watershed communities publicly accessible in one place. NH Coastal Viewer users, which include municipal and state officials, planners, engineers and coastal watershed residents, can explore datasets such as Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) floodplain maps and sea-level rise scenarios; tax parcel boundaries; conserved lands and priorities areas for future conservation; dams and culverts; habitat information including eelgrass, oysters, and salt marshes; aquaculture sites; recreational access points; aerial imagery and topographic information; and much more. Users can analyze data, make maps, and save projects to share with others. The new website streamlines access to the NH Coastal Viewer, provides new training resources including video tutorials, and displays examples of how the data can be used to tell stories about our coastal resources. Gravel & Dirt Road Maintenance Workshop

A one day workshop on cost effective gravel and dirt road maintenance and improvements while reducing pollutants to protect and restore water quality will be held September 29, 2017, 9 AM to 3:30 PM (8:30 registration) at the Gilford Community Church, 19 Potter Hill Road, Gilford, NH. Hosted by NHDES' Watershed Assistance Section and the Belknap County Conservation District, this workshop is designed for road agents, public works department staff, road associations, gravel/dirt road owners, private contractors, watershed and lake associations, and interested residents. Registration is \$45 and includes morning refreshments, a hot lunch, and certificates of Attendance and 5 EnviroCert Prof. Development hours. Topics include: Innovative drainage BMPs, permitting, road surface & materials, drainage easements and maintenance responsibilities.
