Minutes of the Gilmanton Conservation Commission Site Walk and Meeting Held Tuesday, July 27, 2010 at 5:30 P.M. at 111 Pine Circle

Present: Sue Hale-de Seve, Nanci Mitchell, Dick de Seve (Vice Chair), Tracy Tarr (Chair), Erin Hollingsworth

Absent: Joe Derrick, Patrick Hackley, Laurie Churchill

Dick de Seve called the meeting to order at 5:40 pm and appointed Sue Hale-de Seve to vote for Patrick Hackley. Tracy Tarr had recused herself from the discussion as her employer, Stony Ridge Environmental, had prepared the application.

Tracy explained the project, which is to construct a small perched beach, for the applicant. The lower retaining wall will be set back a small distance from the waters edge. All work on the beach can be done without any machinery in jurisdictional areas. The beach will be next to a boathouse which is grandfathered. Steps already lead to the area for the perched beach except for the last couple of feet. Additional steps will be added here. The bank with the steps is steep and vegetated.

Nanci Mitchell moved and Erin Hollingsworth seconded that Dick de Seve sign the minimum impact expedited wetlands application for the Douglas M. Isleib revocable trust to construct a perched beach at 111 Pine Circle, Gilmanton Tax Map/Lot 109/013. The motion was approved unanimously.

Tracy Tarr rejoined the meeting as chair. She said that either Rick Ball or someone from the conservation commission in Belmont would be able to attend the August 10 meeting to explain what Belmont did about the spreading of sludge/biosolids. She will also contact the chair of the Planning Board prior to the joint meeting on August 12 to explain that the CC does not have a position on the spreading of sludge at this time.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:50 pm.
