

Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, August 30, 2005, 7pm
Gilmanton Academy
503 Province Road

Present: Trustees Marion McIntyre, Candace Daigle and Leonard Stockwell, Jr.; Stephen Winchester and Rick Weeks of Buzzell Cemetery Association.

Mr. Winchester and Mr. Weeks submitted:

1. the consummated deed of the Buzzell Cemetery Association's real property to the Town of Gilmanton;
2. a bank check in the amount of \$3,030.48 (\$2,280.48 - balance of the Association's non-care funds, \$600 care funds for David Clairmont, and \$150 care funds for Jan Winchester);
3. maps of the original and new sections of the cemetery and lot layout;
4. copies of the Associations fee schedule, rules, etc.
5. Association records.

Mr. Winchester noted that the final paperwork has been submitted to the State to dissolve the Association. He asked that a letter of acceptance be written to the Association accepting the Cemetery.

M. McIntyre reported on her investigation into the headstones found on the property recently sold by Towle to Wiggins. Her research indicates that the stones are duplicates and that Joshua Parsons and his wife, Judith Badger are buried at Smith Meeting House and have stones at that location.

L. Stockwell reported on his work at the Hatie Smith Burial Ground. He has cleared a 70' x 70' area and feels he has found the extent of the burial ground. He has also researched granite posts and finds we can purchase 6" x 6" x 5' posts already set with a pin in the top for \$99 each (\$2,600). There is still the cost of transportation, setting and chain. The Trustees agreed to purchase the posts.

C. Daigle reported that V. Stanley has agreed to give an easement around the Mary Butler site. She will draft the easement and see if Paul Darbyshire would be willing to produce a plan of the easement for recording. No word to date from the Mary Butler Chapter on replacement of the fence.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30pm
