

Board of Selectmen Town of Gilmanton, New Hampshire

Meeting November 27, 2017 **6:03 pm.** – Gilmanton Academy

Present: Chairman Stephen McWhinnie, Selectman Michael Jean, Selectman Marshall Bishop, Town Administrator Heidi Duval and Administrative Assistant Heather Carpenter. Also present please see attached sign in sheet.

6:03pm Chairman McWhinnie opened the meeting, took attendance of those present and voting (Chairman McWhinnie, Selectman Jean and Selectman Bishop) and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Joint Meeting w/ HDC:

HDC MEMBERS PRESENT- Ernie Hudziec, Betty Ann Abbott, Marshall Bishop(Selectmen's Rep)

District Boundaries-

The Chairman of the Select Board was under the impression that the HDC would consider the conversation to look at the boundaries and suggested that pole or survey be done in the future to find out if the conversation should go further.

This is considered a preliminary discussion, the Chairman of the HDC -Mr. Ernie Hudziec stated that he is obligated to follow the rules and regulations as they exist.

Chairman Hudziec would consider the possibility of a pole in the future.

HDC member-Betty Ann Abbott inquired if the Select Board was considering requesting a change in the HDC boundaries and is concerned about not having the support of the Selectmen.

The public present spoke to the issue and burden that can come with homeownership within the Historic District and believes that the requirements that are placed on the owners should come with the understanding that each circumstance is different and should be considered. If the look of repairs is similar but the materials do not meet the standard of the Commission, it should be considered because the value and the longevity of the product may be better for the home owner. The cost to repairs with homes within the Historic District is costly and some do not have the means to make the repairs that only include materials that are accepted by the Commission.

 The following budgets for Outside Agencies were discussed by the Select Board;
- > Snowmobile Association- Consensus of the board to give the requested amount of \$2,500.
