- 23 Questioned the legality of the Gilmanton Winery conducting business in a residential zone.

- Questioned the school taxes; understands the tax to be unlawful and the billing of those taxes unconstitutional.
- 28 Mr. Haas discussed the RSA in regards to the Town Treasurer, he would like the Board members
- 29 to know he is also running for the position of Town Treasurer in this upcoming election.

- New website discussion- The first meeting is scheduled for 02-12-19, the meeting will focus on
- 36 the design aspect of the new site.
- The Department Heads have been asked to start getting their ideas together for their department

- 39 The idea with the new website is to have greater ease for public use and have more
- 40 documentation available for public viewing.

- 42 **MOTION:** On a Motion by Chairman McWhinnie, and seconded by Selectman Bishop it was voted unanimously to open the consent agenda (3-0).

- Town Administrator discusses the process currently set up between the Fire Dept. and the Town
- for the attire through the student program; Currently, the Town provides a number of attires to
- 54 the call students, the Town pays 50% of the cost and the student pays 50%. The Fire Dept.
- 55 purchases the attire and they get the money back from the student. The Fire Dept. has 100% of
- 56 the cost in the budget which is an issue. The Town Administrator and the Fire Chief have agreed
- 57 that the vendor will charge directly to the student 50% and then the other 50% to the Fire Dept.
- The other option is to have the student pay 100% upfront and send the reimbursement into the
- 59 Town.

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- 60 Chairman is concerned that the process isn't streamlined enough and is concerned where the
- 50% payment is going currently.
- The Town Administrator understands that is should be going into the General Fund but has not
- seen that in his time here.
- The Chairman would like the Town Administrator to confirm where the money is going
- 65 currently.

#### **New Business**

- School EMPG generator- The school is an emergency shelter within the town, they are applying for a grant for a new generator. In order for the school to proceed with the grant for the generator they are required to obtain an endorsement from the Town. The information given to the Board is just for their information at this point, the endorsement is not needed at this time.
- Transfer Station (3-phase power)
- Town Administrator- The rough cost estimate given by New Hampshire Electric Co-op was between 250,000-\$350,000.00 per mile, the location we have to cover is just a little over a mile to the Transfer Station. There is the possibility of issues with ledge and easements for the project.
- This project could not be done this year because it wasn't budgeted but it is something we could
- look at next year. The purpose of three-phase is for the equipment at the Transfer Station.
- 87 Selectmen discussed the possibilities of three phase and how it could positively affect the
- Transfer Station. This past month electricity cost from the Transfer Station is a little less than \$600.00.
- Chairman McWhinnie was wondering if the Co-op would let the Town go and we could see if Public Service would take us and see what the cost through their service would be.

- 97 The Board discussed the current issue of the Right to Know parameters, cost, redaction, the time 98 it takes to fill the request and the process of intake for the request.

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## **Select Board Items**

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Selectman Wilson would like the office to look into the possibility of credit card ability at the Transfer Station. The Board is not opposed to it but would like the Dept. Head to look into the options that could be used. The Town Administrator will look into the possible options and bring it to the Board at a future meeting.

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Selectman Bishop discusses the flow of traffic at the Transfer Station and the possibility of closing one of top entrances and opening an entrance/exit on the lower portion of the property.
