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- Town Administrator-
- "The one that you have is the only contract that exists, it was effective Oct. 22nd but it took some time to be signed.
- I think I mentioned this in a previous public meeting, I was waiting and I agreed to work without 70 71 a contract, hoping that it would be signed any day.
 - At the end of the year I wanted my contract & forced it, a little bit. The contract was good up till February 15th and the process has been delayed."

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The Town Administrator is working off the same contract, there has not been a secondary contract as of right now.

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Town Administrator- The original concept was to see if I could do the job, so there was the first contract with a potential of another contract if I was doing the job correctly.

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Assistant Town Administrator- Essentially, it was an interim contract for a probationary period with the hopes that after the February time frame there would be a more permanent contract. Unfortunately, this Board and Administration have had so much going on, we haven't gotten to that portion yet.

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108 109 Mr. Joe Haas-

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- Lawful monies he is due, he believes the Selectman should order the Town Treasurer to pay him in a currency that he approves of.
- 31 CFR 100.2 letter, written to the Fed., down in Boston
- In 2014, a special minted coin, 300,000 were minted-special edition half dollar. 150,000 were bought by coin collectors and 150,000 were supposed to be sent into circulation. Garda, Loomis Fargo and Brink's pocket them.
- Coinage Act 1965- LBJ- he said that the debased coin that is being circulated, was not to replace the constitutional coin. The constitutional coin was always supposed to be in place.
- Abatement process

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The Board discusses a different payment option other than the check that was already paid to Mr. Haas.

Selectman Wilson pointed out to Mr. Haas, that when he had reached out last year on the payment option of quarters, he called the Bank and they were willing to do that in the amount of \$1,501.00 in quarters but Mr. Haas never got back to him.

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Assistant Town Administrator-This is the recommendation from last week and it still is the recommendation now. We can pay him in cash, if he prefers quarters, I will go to the bank myself and get the quarters. The issue is, he doesn't believe the value is the same. The CFR *letter request*, would still be in place and he would still be coming back for that.

The other issue is, in June, by Mr. Haas' account, but Finance says April, at that point this will be irrelevant to the Board of Selectmen. It will go to unclaimed properties, regardless of whether Mr. Joe Haas thinks it's unclaimed or not, it will go there because on our records it is unclaimed, the check is not cashed. We will not have to deal with this rhetoric or this back and forth and he will have to go down and deal with them, period. He has been given two choices, two valid choices, and if he chooses not to do that, it won't be our issue at a certain point.

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Further discussion was had about the monetary value of the coin.
