71 **Old Business:**

72 Loon Pond Dam- Town Administrator explains the issue;

73 *The Dam is owned by the Town. Previous BOS have used the Association as their agents to*
74 *conduct maintenance of the dam on behalf of the Town. The concern that brought about this*
75 *negotiation is that the Town, in owning this dam, may be subjected to potential liability from*
76 *the*

77 *Dam Bureau, and the goal is to shift that liability onto the Association as the beneficiary of the*
78 *impoundment caused by the Dam. There is no written document that defines rights &*
79 *obligations of the parties which creates exposures for both parties. I had worked with DTC to*
80 *come up with a draft agreement to address the situation.*

81 *Submitted a draft agreement to the Loon Pond owners' Association. I met with Richard*
82 *Hillsgrove who has historically been taking care of the dam on behalf of the Town. Mr.*
83 *Hillsgrove has informed me that the Association has really no financial resources and therefore*
84 *no interest in entering an agreement, and surely not any exposure.*

85 *The dam is on the DES list for annual inspection. Mr. Hillsgrove has agreed to attend the*
86 *inspection. We will ask if there is any "appetite" for the State to take over the dam. If not, I*
87 *foresee two other options: 1) have the Road Agent handle the maintenance going forward, or*
88 *2) contract a third party to perform the maintenance.*

89 *I contacted Bob Carter at a company called NH Dams, who was recommended to me by Robert*

Dow at Crystal Lake District. Mr. Carter currently provides this type of services to the District for their dam. Mr. Carter will provide me with a proposal shortly.

Personnel Policy Manual Update-

Town Administrator recommendation as follows;

I was initially recommending to have the new Manual effective July 1st. I would like to recommend pushing the effective date back to July 15 as the Manual is just been distributed this week to Town employees. I want to give time for them to review, ask questions and return their signed acknowledgement.

Stage Road Bridge C.D. update: The interest accrued so far in the account is \$2, 074.16.

4th of July Association request for additional funds:

Mr. Guarino has requested an additional \$700 to cover unexpected increased firework insurance of (\$500) and flag-related overspend (\$200).

MOTION: On a motion by Chairman Bishop and seconded by Selectman Warren it was voted to request background information for the expenses paid on the event. (2-0)

Further discussion on the 4th of July event being run by the association vs Town Hall involvement.

Fire Department hiring practice for call/student firefighters:

Background information is as follows:

- 2014 memo actually states specifically "All part-time and full-time employees of the Police and Fire Department are subject to polygraph test in accordance with State of NH standards".

- while the NH Police Academy requires polygraphs, the NH Standards for Fire Departments does not.

- the new Town Hiring Policy, effective since June 1, states "The Town may require an applicant for a job to undergo additional testing or background examinations, including, but not limited to, ...polygraph examination..."

- not "shall"

- RSA 485-A:24, which is specifically referenced in the Hiring Policy, does relate to employee working with children in a recreation camp setting

Town Administrators recommendation to the Board would be to agree with The Fire Chief proposal that polygraphs are not required for call/student firefighters.

MOTION: On a motion by Selectman Warren and seconded by Chairman Bishop it was voted to wave the requirement of Polygraphs for call/student firefighters. (2-0)

Select Board Items:

The Chairman of the HDC would like to meet with a Chairman from each Board; Selectman, Planning, HDC, and Zoning. Chairman Bishop had agreed to bring this up to the Board of Selectmen but it hasn't been addressed. The workshop is to discuss a possible warrant article to change the zoning and or districts.

It is a workshop that doesn't technically require minutes because it's not a quorum of any

singular Board, however, it might be a good idea to record it.

Outcome of discussion: Board members agree that it would be helpful and to proceed setting a date with Chairman Hudziec.

Dear residents of Gilmanton,

On June 13, 2019, the Town Clerk received a Gilmanton Voters Request by Petition, a copy of which is attached herewith. The Petition seeks to have the Board of Selectmen warn a Special Town Meeting related to the Board of Selectmen's authority to fill a vacancy on the Board of Selectmen.

The Petition originated from the anticipated vacancy on the Board resulting from Selectman Wilson's anticipated resignation. Selectman Wilson has not resigned to-date and there is currently no vacancy on the Board of Selectmen.

The Town, thereafter, learned that the Petition's primary sponsor sought to withdraw the Petition.

Notwithstanding, the Town has not received a withdrawal of the Petition from the other signatories of the Petition, and, therefore, the Board has had the Petition reviewed by the Town's legal counsel. The Town's legal counsel reviewed the Petition against existing New Hampshire election laws, and discussed the Petition with the Secretary of State's Office. After consulting with the Town's legal counsel, the Board has determined that the articles presented are unlawful and violate New Hampshire law. Based on this determination, the Board of Selectmen has unanimously decided to decline warning the Special Town Meeting as requested by the Petition.

If and when Selectman Wilson resigns, the Board intends to advertise the vacancy and seek interest from potential candidates. Applicants will be asked to submit a letter of interest by an established due date. The Board will make the list of applicants and their respective letters of interest available to the public.


As set forth in New Hampshire law, specifically RSA 669:63, the remaining Selectmen have the authority to appoint a replacement, and, if they fail to fill the vacancy, any citizen of the Town would then be able to petition the Superior Court to fill the vacancy. The Superior Court will then fill the vacancy with a "suitable person".

There is an alternative protocol under RSA 669:61, IV to fill vacancies by special election that can be deployed if and when the remaining Selectmen fail to appoint an individual to fill the vacancy within 45 days. However, to use this alternative protocol, the Town Meeting would first have to adopt this alternative protocol. To date, the Town has not adopted this optional procedure and, consequently, this alternative procedure is currently not available.

Therefore, the only protocol for filling a vacancy on the Board of Selectmen in the Town of Gilmanton is for the remaining selectmen to fill the vacancy, failing which a citizen may petition the Superior Court for the appointment of a "suitable replacement."
