Board of Selectmen
08 April 2013
Minutes

6:00pm - Chairman Ralph Lavin called the meeting to order. Present were Chairman Lavin, Selectman Brett Currier and Selectman Don Guarino, Town Accountant Jen Correia and Tom Scribner. Recorder Stephanie Fogg.

Chairman Lavin took attendance of those present and voting and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

6:03pm – John Dickey and Tom Howe Update on Land Trust - Gilmanton’s Greatest Views for Everyone Forever! John Dickey gave an overview of the conservation and history of the George Twigg III properties. Four tracts, total 86 acres, which includes Frisky Hill View Point South, Meeting House Pond Tract with Barn, Frisky Hill (coming down the hill towards pond the field on the left hand side), and Loon Pond Road Field at junction of Griffin Road. George Twigg made much of this possible as a donation, by accepting less than full value for the land. The Land Trust put about a year and a half of effort into raising the remaining funds. There was a tremendous response by many, including: residents here in Gilmanton, federal grants and state funded grants. The total amount of the purchase including easements, appraisals, legal, real estate transaction cost and fundraising was \$1.2 million. The goal was successfully reached in 2012.

Two of the properties (Frisky Hill View Point South and the Meeting House Pond Tract) will be deeded to the Town of Gilmanton and the Land Trust will make provisions that there will be no loss of tax revenue to the Town. They will give \$20,000 in a trust fund to the Town to cover the taxes, the principle to remain and interest to pay the tax.

The other two tracts will be sold by the Land Trust to private owners, subject to the conservation easements. Selectmen Guarino asked if the money raised by the sale of these two parcels was in any way contingent on the closing of the deed on the other two parcels to the Town. Tom Howe explained that the money from the sale would likely be used to purchase other conservation parcels and was not a factor in the transfer of the deed. Easements will be held by the Five Rivers Conservation Trust, who currently hold other conservation easements in Gilmanton. There is still ongoing work to be completed,

3 John and Tom will continue to update the Board of Selectmen on this project. They
4 handed out an overview for the record, of the current official obligations of the Town.
5 Chairman Lavin thanked John Dickey and Tom Howe for their efforts for The Town of
6 Gilmanton and the conservation of these properties.

8 **6:45 pm- John Dickey Regarding Window Restoration at The Academy.**

9 John Dickey has been acting as the volunteer project manager for the window restoration
10 project. Almost complete, he has done a punch list walk through with the contractor.
11 The basement windows were not originally part of the restoration, but he believes that
12 they should be replaced also. There should still be funds from the original grant to cover
13 the basement window replacement.

15 **6:47 pm – Transfer Station -** Jen Correia stated that the Transfer Station needs
16 coverage for personnel for two Wednesdays, April 17th and April 24th. Selectmen
17 Guarino suggested that we meet the need by taking a current employee of the Town to
18 cover. Selectmen Guarino will speak with Paul Perkins of the Highway Department and
19 Ron Nason at the Transfer Station to secure coverage.

21 **6:52 pm Security System** – Jen Correia reported that she had a quote from Mango
22 regarding the portable security units. There currently is only one mobile unit and it is
23 shared at this time.

25 **6:54 pm – Doors on Second Floor at The Academy** – Jen reported on a quote from J.R.
26 Stockwell to repair the hinges for doors to be opened completely. The quote was \$250 for
27 labor and material. Selectman Guarino will speak with Mr. Stockwell to make sure the
28 repair will resolve the current problem with the doors.

30 **6:58 pm – Chairman Ralph Lavin Called for a Short Recess.**

32 **7:00 pm – Back from Recess, Opened Meeting - Public Input**

34 Present also at this time were Tom Scribner, Tom and Paula Farley.
35

36 **Piano at the Academy** - Tom Scribner would like to start work on the piano in the
37 Academy if there are no objections. Chairman Lavin and Selectman Currier agreed that
38 Mr. Scribner could begin work on the piano.

40 **Glass Crusher at the Transfer Station** - Tom Scribner also brought up conversation
41 about the glass crusher at the Transfer Station. He said before extensive crushing
42 happens, the crusher needs to be thoroughly cleaned. It has not been maintained in a long
43 time and as they are not fully staffed there is not time to maintain the machine. Tom
44 suggested volunteers with equipment that might be donated for a period of time until
45 there is a final set up to help at the Transfer Station. Chairman Lavin was concerned
46 about the liability for the Town. Selectman Currier inquired as to the type of equipment

3 he was talking about. Mr. Scribner replied that it would be equipment to help re-pile the
4 glass.

6 **Bee Hive** – Paula Farley mentioned that there was a large bee hive at the entry of the
7 Academy Building that needed to be taken care of. Selectman Guarino suggested that
8 the new maintenance man be informed and to take care of it.

9
10 **Transfer Station** – Chairman Lavin spoke of paper and trash that has been blown into
11 the woods at the Transfer Station. Considering the amount of staff currently at the
12 Transfer Station, there is not enough time to keep up with the blown trash. When there is
13 more staff, it could be picked up. Tom Scribner suggested the possibility of volunteers
14 helping with the blown trash.

16 **7:15 pm – General Business** – Selectman Guarino spoke of the door lock system for
17 security for the back door. Jen reported, with the new system people would get a code
18 for that day only to enter the building and reduce the amount of keys that are currently
19 handed out. Selectman Guarino will get proposals.

20
21 **Fourth of July** - Selectman Guarino (also President of the 4th of July Committee)
22 announced the date is set for the fireworks. They will be the Saturday after the fourth,
23 which is July 6th 2013 at Crystal Lake Park.

24
25 **7:25 pm – Close Public Input** – Chairman Lavin closed the public session.

26
27 **7:26 pm – Brian Forst, Budget Committee Chair – 2014** – Suggestions for budget
28 season. As the re-elected Chair to the Budget Committee, Mr. Forst was asked by the
29 Budget Committee to meet with the Board of Selectman and the School Board to see if
30 there could be a joint effort in budgets regarding employee benefits. Mr. Forst said that
31 Rich Bakos, who is currently on the Budget Committee would like to speak to someone
32 with forward thinking in this area. Selectman Currier suggested that the school
33 employees are part of a union and the Town is not. Rich Bakos is passionate about this
34 because of the skyrocketing rates and the increased percentage that every employee will
35 have to pay. Jen Correia will check with LGC to see what combining would do.
36 Selectmen Currier would like to see that it is fair across the board. Chairman Lavin
37 agrees that whatever helps the taxpayer.

39 Brian Forst said the mission is to find cost savings to the Town. He will visit with the
40 School Board next week. Chairman Lavin will sit on the Budget Committee as
41 Selectmen's Representative.

18 It has been brought to the Selectmen’s attention regarding building use at the Academy
19 and Old Town Hall, and the liability to the Town as the buildings are being used by the
20 public. Selectman Guarino will contact LGC and report back with his findings about
21 insurance coverage that the Town already has in place.
