6:00 p.m. Chairman Jean opened the meeting, took attendance of those present and voting (Chairman Jean, Selectman McWhinnie, and Selectman Bishop) and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes -

Old Business

Space Needs- Conference Room

Chairman Jean calls to table this discussion so that other department heads, boards and committees can be reached for input in the matter. The Board agrees to table the discussion until July 11, 2016, at that meeting they will make a decision to use the room as office space or continue use as a conference room.

New Business

Update on New Hampshire Electric Co-op walk through-

There suggestion is to have an internal energy audit and they will be providing a summary of the walk through with their suggestions.

Switching the lights to LED will have a payback within a three to four year period and the life span of the lights is 50,000 hours. After the total cost is paid by the Town there is a 50% pay back from New Hampshire Electric Co-op and a payment plan is available.

Wage Scale- The other Towns that were used as a comparable to help formulate a wage scale for Gilmanton were; Bristol, Campton, Chesterfield, Greenland, Sunapee, Walpole, and Wilton. The wage scale/grade will be added to the job descriptions when the wage scale is completed.

Job Descriptions are in the process of being reformatted, once completed they will be presented to each employee for signature and will then go to the Board of Selectmen for final signatures.

The Board would like a signature line added for Department Heads to be added to each of their employee's job descriptions.

The 4th of July Fireworks date will be placed on the website this week. The date for the event is Saturday, July 2, 2016 with a rain date of July 4, 2016.

Lawn Care- Consensus of the Select Board is to have Matt Young for lawn maintenance for the Academy Building, Public Safety Building and the Old Town Hall. He is insured for one million dollars and the Town will require proof of insurance. His rates will be per week and a letter of confirmation will be sent out this week. There is clarification needed if Mr. Young's price also includes weed whacking and blowing.

Select Board Items

There will not be a Selectmen's Meeting on July 4th and it will be posted on the website.

Chairman Jean opens the floor to public comment.

Mrs. Bernadette Gallant would like an amendment to the June 6, 2016 minutes to properly reflect that the Library Trustees appoint the trustee's for the library and not the Board of Selectmen.

Mrs. Brenda Currier spoke about the downstairs conference room and the process for getting a permit for signs in the Town. She also would like to know if the Fire Department is requiring their new hires to take a polygraph and if the Selectmen have reconsidered recording their meetings.

Mrs. Jean would not like to see the conference room taken out of use for the Town Clerk Tax Collector office space needs. She believes that by moving the meetings upstairs this will hinder people with medical conditions due to lack of cooling.

Chairman Jean closes the floor to public comment.

There is a discussion by the Board on whether they would like to reconsider recording their meetings for the benefit of the public.
