8	The meeting room was closed to the public. Present during the Non-Public Session were
9	Selectman Currier and Selectman Guarino, Town Administrator Arthur Capello, Assistant
9 10	Stephanie Fogg and Transfer Station Department Head Ed Lang.

12	The Selectmen discussed a personnel issue with Ed Lang.
13	
14	MOTION: On a Motion by Selectman Currier and seconded by Selectman Guarino it was voted
15	unanimously to come out of Non-Public Session at 6:35pm. (2-0 Voice Vote – Selectman Currier
16	– yes, Selectman Guarino – yes).

18	The meeting room was opened to the public. The Board noted the Non-Public Session minutes
19	were sealed.

21	6:36 pm Selectman Currier called for a recess.
22	
23	6:45 pm Selectman Currier re-opened the meeting.
24	
25	<b>Road Agent</b> - Arthur checked with other towns on their descriptions for Road Agents.
26	Selectman Guarino asked if the Town currently had a job description for the Road Agent.
27	Arthur said not that he could locate. Selectman Currier and Selectman Guarino read the policy.
28	These were descriptions that were taken from towns that have Elected Road Agents.
29	
30	Selectman Currier and Selectman Guarino liked the description and they would like to have Paul
31	Perkins, Road Agent, look it over as well. It is just to update the responsibilities of the Road
32	Agent for the files. Arthur will get a copy to Paul Perkins for his review and get back to the
33	Selectmen.

35	Planning Board- Arthur Capello said that William Mahoney has presented a letter to the
36	Selectmen to be reappointed to the Planning Board. The Selectmen and Arthur agreed that they
37	would wait until after the elections before addressing appointments.

39	6:50 pm Public-Input – Selectman Currier opened Public- Input
40	<b>0.30 pm I ubic-input</b> – Selectinan Currier opened I ubic- input
40	School Deliberative Session – The information was brought to the attention of the Selectmen by
42	a concerned citizen, Elena Ball. If you read the minutes from the School Deliberative Session it
43	has come to the attention of the Town and the Budget Committee that the School has not handed
44 45	over monies/tax dollars that had been given to them for Capital Reserve Funds and Expendable
45 46	Trust Funds for two years that we know of. These are tax dollars that are being abused. Per $PSA$ the funds should be turned over within 20 days of the cleation or by June 20 <sup>th</sup> of the year it
46	RSA the funds should be turned over within 20 days of the election or by June 30 <sup>th</sup> of the year it
47	was voted on.
48	

1 It is up to the Town to be in touch with the Trustees of the Trust Funds to see if they have a

- 2 policy, what their policy is, whether or not they are following their own policy? What the
- 3 Attorney General's Office has recommended that the Trustees of the Trust Funds bring forward
- 4 to the Town, to the Selectmen, an accounting of all Capital Reserves and Expendable Trust
- 5 Funds that the School has. So you would know the dollar amounts and whether or not they have
- 6 been funded. It was recommended 5-7 years of documentation. The Trustees should have an
- 7 accounting of each year if it was voted to be funded.
- 8
- 9 Also, an FYI for the Selectmen, the School's Warrant Articles were not signed by all members of
- 10 the School Board. According to the new RSA's if anything has to do with money, the Warrant
- 11 Articles need to be signed by all members. There are other issues where monies are being used
- 12 for items that originally they were not appropriated for.
- 13
- 14 The Selectmen will have that information forwarded to the Trustees of the Trust Funds and have
- 15 them look into it. Selectman Guarino said the Selectmen will follow up on this.

### 17 Right to Know Request for Non-Public Sealed and Non-Public Not- Sealed Minutes – A

- 18 request for Board of Selectmen's Meeting Minutes dating back to January of 2013- current
- 19 meetings by Vinnie Baiochetti. Arthur said he has already made available to Mr. Baiochetti the
- 20 Non-Public Not-Sealed Minutes. He has been in and looked at those; we still have the
- 21 outstanding issue of the sealed minutes. Arthur said he has been advised by Town Counsel to
- have someone review the sealed minutes and come back to the Board with recommendations as
- 23 to specific instructions as to which minutes should be left sealed and those that could be
- unsealed. Arthur Capello said it should be a member of the Board for those minutes that pre-date
- 25 Arthur's attendance at the meetings. Selectman Guarino said that according to Town Counsel as
- long as the Board feels those sealed minutes could still hurt someone that they should not be
- 27 opened. The Selectmen requested a work session to go through the sealed minutes together.
- Arthur will inform Vinnie Baiochetti that the Board has chosen to go through the sealed minutes
- together as a group and Arthur will set a date for a work session when Chairman Lavin returnsfrom vacation.

- 32 Also Mrs. Donovan has requested information. Arthur has responded to her request in the
- 33 appropriate time. Arthur said we have to run the day to day Town operations and we are
- 34 responding as quickly as we can. The Selectmen repeated that they do not want to be in any
- 35 violation of the law, Arthur assured them they would not be.

- Welfare Guidelines –Request by Robin McGlone, Welfare Director, to remove guidelines from
   our Welfare Guidelines because of the new State Law that passed.

- 40 **MOTION:** On a Motion by Selectman Guarino, and seconded by Selectman Currier it was 41 voted unanimously to remove the following Welfare Guidelines "No person receiving old age
- 42 assistance, or financial aid to the permanently or totally disabled, under RSA 167 or 161, shall at
- 43 the time be eligible for general assistance, except for emergency medical assistance as defined.
- 44 RSA 167:27"; in accordance with the recently passed State Welfare Guidelines. (2-0).

Tax Impact of Warrant Articles: Selectman Currier wanted to be sure that the corrections on 1 2 the Tax Impact numbers will be explained and put out there for the voters. Selectman Guarino 3 said there will be corrections put in the Daily Sun and the Suncook Valley Sun. Arthur Capello 4 said he will also put it up on the Town Website. 5 6 Highway Department: Culvert on the Meadow Pond Road Extension. Selectman Guarino 7 spoke with Road Agent Paul Perkins, because of the weather this year there has been ice coming 8 across a driveway. As it is an unusual winter for weather Selectman Guarino would like to look 9 at the driveway again. Selectman Guarino recommended that the Roads Committee look at this 10 situation. Arthur Capello will contact Roads Committee Chairman, Mr. Daigle to follow-up. 11 12 Arthur Capello said for your information, we may be over budget before the end of this year with 13 snow removal and salt/sand costs. We may not be able to do as many "projects" as we have 14 planned because of budget concerns. 15 16 Arthur Capello said we have about 30% of our snow removal and 20% of our overtime budgets 17 left for the year. Selectman Currier and Selectman Guarino both agreed that they may have to 18 freeze the overtime budget later this year, because we may need to have it in November or 19 December. 20 21 Selectman Guarino said we should get out of the Winter Season, see where we are at, and speak 22 with Paul Perkins about this so he knows far enough in advance to plan. Arthur said he wanted 23 to bring it to the Boards attention so everyone is aware. 24 25 Floors and Stairway – Arthur Capello said that the entire first floor and the stairway will be 26 refinished on Memorial Day weekend. 27 28 Water in the Basement - Selectman Currier said it should be put out to bid to be corrected. 29 Arthur said he did order an industrial humidifier. Arthur said he will put out a request for 30 proposal for roofing and wall fix. Arthur Capello said he would like the Selectmen to look at 31 the drip edge/roofing and wall to give him the proper scope of the project before putting it out to

- bid. Selectman Guarino and Selectman Currier agreed they would look at both projects. Arthur
   will have the proposals ready for the March 17, 2014 Board of Selectmen's Meeting for the
  - 34 Selectmen's review.
