December 8, 2021 Minutes. Amend line 79 from j\$88,000 to \$33,500 for GYRL income.

Moved to accept as amended by Vinnie Baiocchetti, seconded by Joanne Melle.

December 15, 2021 Minutes.

Moved to accept as presented by Vinnie Baiocchetti, seconded by Joanne Melle.

Changes to Town budget. Selectman Baiocchetti pointed out changes to the budget.

#17 on Summary Page: General Gov't Buildings shows an increase to a total of \$104,769 due to increase in the alarm system for the Old Town Hall.

#18 Cemetery Expense shows increase to a total of \$16,888 due to a 6% increase for seasonal employees.

#24 Fire Department shows significant decrease to a total of \$752,072 due to pulling costs for two new positions and placing them in a warrant article.

The Town budget has a 9.58% increase.

Warrant Articles

#3 – Operating Budget: \$4,675, 342.

#4 – Fire Truck Replacement: \$555,000 coming from unassigned fund balance, \$295,000 coming from Capital Reserve Fund. Zero dollar tax impact.

#5 - Fire Dept. Salary/Wages. See if voters will fund 2 new positions.

#6 – Adding to existing ETFs and CRFs. No discussion

#7 – Town Driveways: \$80,000 to go in Town Driveways Capital Reserve Fund. This is for all town driveways, but primarily for Safety Building driveway repairs of \$159,000. Discussion around the drainage problem at Safety Building.

#8 – Establish Non-Cap Reserve Fund Infrastructure Repairs and Updates

\$100,000. Town is behind on road improvements and repairs. Town has been given Federal monies of \$195,000 and more to come for next year. This will be used primarily for ditching and culverts.

#9 - Purchase Police Cruiser

\$51,000. No discussion.

#10 - Purchase Security System for the Public Safety Building

\$24,000. Need to camera the outside of the building and the tech is old inside. Needs update.

#11 – Energy Upgrades to Town Facilities

\$40,000. No discussion

#12 - Deeded Property Cleanup

\$7,000. To clean up identified properties so they can then be sold.

#13 – Sale of Town Properties – no discussion

#14 – Land use Change Tax. Brian asked how this will affect revenues. No real disadvantage to the town. Selectmen felt request of 50% not an unreasonable request.

#15 – Conservation Commission Membership. No discussion.

#16 – Adopt All Veteran's Tax Credit. This is a change from specific time frames (i.e. war, conflict) to anyone who served at least 90 days.

#17 - Support the GYRL (by petition) \$47,100. No discussion

#18 - Gilmanton Youth Organization \$5,500. No discussion

#19 – New Beginnings. \$1,000. No discussion.

#20 – Community Action Program. \$5,000. No discussion.

#21 – Lakes Region Mental Health Center. \$7,500. No discussion.

#22 - Gilmanton Snowmobile Association. \$2,500. Selectmen will ask them to come in next year to explain their request.

#23 – Gilmanton Iron Works Library. \$1,000. No discussion.

#24 - Granite VNA. \$7,600. No discussion.

#25 - CASA. \$1,000. No discussion.

#26 – Rocky Pond Association Milfoil. \$1,000. No discussion.

#27 – Gilmanton Fourth of July Association. \$5,000. No discussion.

#28 – Mid-State Health Center. \$270. No discussion.

Discussion on Revenue Worksheet. Brian noted amounts are down a little from last year. Cost of permits pretty much covers cost of Building Inspector salary/benefits. Noted Motor Vehicle permit fees are up. Steve was glad to see things are trending up in the Bulky Waste line. Total revenues look down a lot, but that's because last year was the Crystal Lake Bridge Project. Question as to why there is no recommendation from Admin or Selectmen for Trust Fund line 01-3915-010. Net valuation of property is up about \$8.1 million.

Other topics: Steve brought up that we only go over the school budget once prior to Super Saturday. He wondered if that can change in the future since it's such a large budget. We look at and discuss the Town budget closely. Should be doing same for school.

Sawyer Lake Budget: Rich Adams presented a budget of f\$111,983.00.
