- 6 Committee Members Present: Chairman Brian Forst, Vice Chairman Anne Kirby, Members Alec Bass, Joshua
- 7 Mann, Ron Leclerc, Grace Sisti, Sawyer Lake Village District Rep. Rich Adams, School Board Rep. Michelle Heyman,
- 8 and Selectmen's Rep. Vinnie Baiocchetti.
- 9 Members of Town Present: Selectman Mark Warren, Selectman Evan Collins, Town Administrator Heather
- 10 Carpenter, Road Agent Paul Perkins, Fire Chief Paul Hempel, Police Chief Matt Currier.
- 11 Public Present: ???
- 12 Line 4311, Highway Administration \$565,949 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass.
- 13 There was a discussion on clarifying line 4311-690 as this was redistributed to line 4311-610 per previous budget
- 14 meeting, about reducing line 4311-665 HA Rep. & Maint. Sanders and on fuel costs. Chairman Forst moved to
- reduce line 4311-665 by \$1,500 for total of \$5K, seconded by Member Leclerc or Mann. There was mention
- about moving that \$1,500 to the line 4311-636 for diesel. Vote: passed to reduce line 4311-465 by \$1,500 with
- one no vote. Line 4311 for Highway Administration to \$564,449 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by
- 18 Member Bass. Vote: passed \$564,449.
- 19 Line 4312, Highways & Streets \$506,900 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Due to
- the default budget in 2022 the mowing and culverts money was moved elsewhere. Vote: passed 506,900.
- 21 Line 4316, Street Lighting \$5K moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed \$5K.
- 22 Line 4319, Road Betterment \$274,232 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. The
- 23 decrease is due to having encumbered funds but due to receiving State money not as much is needed. TA
- 24 Carpenter shared that the Sargent Rd and Meeting House Rd projects would not have been done if it wasn't for
- 25 the surplus or ARPA funds. The current projects for Sargent Rd and Meeting House Rd would not be done with
- the funds in the budget. Member Bass asked that wasn't the purpose of the Infrastructure CIP last year was to
- 27 start building money to invest in our roads. TA Carpenter stated the infrastructure covers a lot of things but per
- 28 the road assessment report, we need millions of dollars. It is currently going through the BOS in pieces with our
- 29 full attention to put the money into that fund. Vote: passed \$274,232.
- 30 Article #07, Add to existing ETFs Non-Capital Expendable Trust Funds and CRFs Capital Reserve Funds —
- 31 Chairman Forst moved Article #07 for discussion. There is \$70K for Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund
- and that account has a balance of \$265,062. The next purchase would be a six-wheeler truck estimated at \$175-
- 33 \$200K. Highway Vehicle Equip/Repair for \$10K and covers most things. Chairman Forst moved to table until
- 34 later in the meeting.
- 35 Line 4220, Fire Department \$1,000,319 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. There was
- discussion on diesel and fuel costs. Vice Chairman Kirby asked if the two positions were filled and only one
- 37 currently is. Discussion regarding the vehicle repair line since last year they were over but are asking for less this
- 38 year. The fire truck they have for sale has been sold. Vote: passed \$1,000,319.

- 39 **Line 4290, Emergency Management** \$2,500 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. There
- 40 was discussion on spending of the funds. Vote: passed \$2,500.
- 41 Article #05, Ambulance & Equipment Lease/Purchase Chairman Forst moved Article #05 for \$419,766,
- 42 seconded by Member Bass. The article was explained based on its complexity. There was discussion around the
- 43 voters understanding this article. Member Sisti asked if the Operating Budget can be #05 and this be #06. TA
- Carpenter stated there is a process and leases have to go before Operating Budget. There was a discussion
- 45 regarding whether a 3/5 majority vote is required and if a member of the public can make changes to the
- 46 monetary value of this article. Vote: passed, Budget Committee recommends Article #05 for \$419,766.
- 47 Line 4210, Police Department \$787,212 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Member
- 48 Sisti asked if there were any small cuts that could be made. Police Chief Currier stated this budget is pretty tight.
- There was discussion about the part-time position being proposed in the secretary's line. Selectmen's Rep.
- 50 Baiocchetti stated next year they are doing the salary schedule for other Town employees. Police Chief Currier
- 51 stated their calls are 20% higher than last year so his employees are doing more work with the same amount of
- 52 people. There was discussion around how many officers Gilmanton has vs other towns, the increase in call
- volume, and the part-time officer position of 25 hrs. Vote: passed \$787,212.
- 54 Article #11, Purchase Police Cruiser Chairman Forst moved Article #11 for \$69K, seconded by Member Bass.
- 55 To fund this cruiser \$20K will be taken out of the Police Outside Detail Fund that currently has a balance of \$23K
- and \$49K through taxation. Vote: passed, Budget Committee recommends Article #11 for \$69K.
- 57 Brief recess 9:50 am back in session 9:57 am.
- 58 Line 4130, Executive \$452,207 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Member Sisti asked
- if the Town used the appreciation budget this year and they did. There was discussion on why the increase in
- 60 line 4130-271 appreciation as the Selectmen want to do something more for the employees. It was asked if the
- 61 training line 4130-270 will be used going forward. More training will be required when the new finance person
- 62 is hired and the costs for other trainings has increased. Vote: passed \$452,207.
- 63 Line 4131, Computer Technology \$55,559 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. TA
- 64 Carpenter stated last year there was an error as finance reported the wrong number for the default budget
- 65 which was short so that had to be taken from other places. All the companies we use are subscription based so
- 66 we pay them monthly. The email program has to be paid upfront and we do provide emails to all board
- 67 members. Member Sisti asked if any of these amount's negotiable. TA Carpenter stated the security packages
- are the only items that are negotiable as the others are contracts. There was discussion about having the line
- 69 items shown under this line since this is where the department line items were redistributed. Vote: passed
- 70 \$55,559.

- Action Item: Show amounts from the dept. computer lines that were redistributed into this line.
- 72 Line 4140, Election & Registration \$11,094 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. TA
- 73 Carpenter stated there is an increase in Supervisors of the Checklist to \$15/hr, which is the first increase in at
- 74 least 10 years. Vote: passed \$11,094.
- 75 Line 4150, Finance \$177,795 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. TA Carpenter stated
- there is an increase as the Finance/HR person is leaving by April 1 and we will need to fill this position as full-
- time. It was asked if it will be fruitful to hire a separate HR person but in reality, the Town cannot afford that at
- 78 this time. Vote: passed \$177,795.
- 79 Line 4151, TCTX \$251,437 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. There was discussion to
- 80 remove line 4151-116 position and keep and hire for line 4151-115, the 20 hrs week position. Member Bass
- motioned to reduce the total TCTX budget from \$251,437 to \$244,807, seconded by Member Mann or Leclerc.
- 82 There was discussion regarding document restoration & storage line item. Vote: passed \$244,807.

- 83 Line 4152, Prop Tax/Assessing \$58,415 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote:
- 84 passed \$58,415.
- 85 Line 4153, Legal \$80K moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. There was discussion
- 86 regarding where the Town is with court cases. Chairman Forst proposed to reduce this line 4153-320 by \$10K to
- 87 be recommended at \$70K, seconded by Member Leclerc or Bass. There was a discussion about what contractual
- items are in the legal line. Vote: passed \$70K with two no votes.
- 89 Line 4191, Planning Board \$13,893 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed
- 90 \$13,893.
- 91 Line 4192, Zoning Board \$2,850 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed
- 92 \$2,850
- 93 Line 4193, Historic District Board \$660 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote:
- 94 passed \$660.
- 95 **Line 4194, General Govt Blds** \$150,365 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass.
- 96 Groundskeeping increase is due to a contract. Discussion about custodial increase due to LCHIP grant.
- 97 Discussion on line 4194-630 as it is same as last year. Vote: passed \$150,365.
- 98 Action Item: If items have moved out of this line why the \$7,800 is same as last year.
- 99 Line 4195, Cemetery Expense \$16,963 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote:
- 100 passed \$16,963.
- 101 Line 4196, Insurance \$111,867 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed
- 102 \$111,867.
- 103 Line 4240, Building Inspector \$47,785 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote:
- 104 passed \$47,785.
- 105 Line 4323, HHW Hazardous Waste Collection \$3,701 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member
- 106 Bass. Vote: passed \$3,701.
- 107 Line 4324, SW Transfer/Recycling Ctr \$487,779 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass.
- 108 Selectmen's Rep. Baiocchetti motioned to take \$22K from the two part-time positions. Seconded by Member
- 109 Bass. There was discussion regarding this reduction and the part-time positions. Selectmen's Rep. Baiocchetti
- amended his motioned to take \$22K from the two part-time positions to reduce line 4324 to \$465,779,
- 111 seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed as amended to \$465,779. Member Bass motioned to change the total
- transfer/recycling budget from \$465,779 to \$465,279, seconded by Vice Chairman Kirby. This reduction would
- 113 come from line 4324-680 for \$500. Vote: passed \$465,279. Vote: passed for total amended to \$465,279 by
- 114 Budget Committee recommendation.
- 115 Line 4441, General Assistance \$25,400 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. There was
- a discussion about the funds in this line. Vote: passed \$25,400.
- 117 Line 4520, Parks & Recreation \$32,367 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vice
- 118 Chairman Kirby to reduce this budget by \$2,000 to \$30,367, seconded Member Bass. This reduction would
- 119 come from line 4520-430 repairs & maintenance. TA Carpenter spoke about the aging structures at the park and
- 120 have an estimate to repair pole barn for \$7K. There was discussion about the structures to be covered under
- 121 infrastructure and maintenance. Member Mann asked about line 4520-640 includes trash removal. There is no
- separate dumpster at the park. There was discussion about other things that need to be done at the park. Vote:
- passed as amended to 30,367. Vote: passed \$30,367 by Budget Committee recommendation.
- 124 **Line 4550, Library** \$8,150 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed \$8,150.

- 125 Line 4583, Patriotic Purposes \$1,800 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass. The increase
- is due to flags made in America cost more than if bought from China. Vote: passed \$1,800.
- 127 Line 4611, Conservation Commission \$3,000 moved by Vice Chairman Kirby, seconded by Member Bass.
- 128 Vote: passed \$3,000.
- 129 **Town Warrant Articles:**
- 130 Article #06, Operating Budget Chairman Forst moved Operating Budget for the Town is \$5,092,570, seconded
- 131 by Member Bass. This number reflects \$42,630 reduction from the original number. Vote: passed Budget
- 132 Committee recommendation of \$5,092,570.
- 133 Article #07, Add to existing ETFs Non-Capital Expendable Trust Funds and CRFs Capital Reserve Funds for —
- 134 Chairman Forst recalled Article #07 as they have already discussed the Highway Equipment and Highway Vehicle
- 135 Equip/Repair. Member Sisti asked about the majority vote required. TA Carpenter will check on that.
- 136 Action Item: Check on the wording "Majority vote required".
- 137 Member Mann totally supports this article but asked where is the plan or what is the plan. He doesn't like
- 138 putting money into an account without knowing the plan. Selectmen Warren stated, as the Planning Board
- 139 Rep., he agrees with his comment. This coming year one of the main objectives for the Planning Board is to
- work on the CIP and have more specifics for it. TA Carpenter stated there is a CIP plan but it is just not updated.
- 141 Chairman Forst read the three remaining items for Recycling/Transfer Station in this article and discussion
- ensued about costs to replace equipment. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #07 for \$165K.
- 143 Article #08, Revaluation Capital Reserve There was discussion about costs and time it takes for revaluation.
- 144 Vote: passed Budget Committee supports Article #08 for \$40K.
- 145 Article #09, CR Academy Mechanical Upgrades Chairman Forst moved Article #09 for \$25K, seconded by
- 146 Member Bass. Discussion was held about the use of this fund. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article
- 147 #09 for \$25K.
- 148 Article #10, Establish an Accrued Liability Expendable Trust Fund Explanation of this article was given and a
- 149 discussion ensued. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #10 for \$50K.
- 150 Article #12, Re-Adopt the Optional Veterans' Tax Credit under RSA 72:28, II There was a discussion about this
- 151 State required article. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #12.
- 152 Article #13, Re-Adopt All Veterans' Tax Credit under RSA 72:28-b Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports
- 153 Article #13.
- 154 Article #14, Establish a Forest Maintenance Fund This article was pulled at a previous meeting by the
- 155 Selectmen. There was a discussion regarding what this article was about.
- 156 **Article #17, By Petition Amend the Elderly Tax Exemption** There was a discussion about this article. Vote:
- NOT passed, Budget Committee DOES NOT support Article #17.
- 158 Article #19, By Petition Support the Gilmanton Year-Round Library Vice Chairman Kirby amended the cost
- to say \$47,100, seconded Member ????. There was a discussion about the monetary amount. Vote: passed,
- 160 Budget Committee supports Article #19 for \$47,100.
- 161 Article #20, Support the Gilmanton Youth Organization Chairman Forst moved Article #20 for \$10K, seconded
- 162 by Member Bass. There was a discussion regarding the amount they are requesting with the information they
- 163 provided. Vote: NOT passed, Budget Committee DOES NOT support Article #20 for \$10K.
- 164 Selectmen's Rep. Baiocchetti motioned to accept Articles #21-29, no second.

- 165 Article #21, Support the New Beginnings without Violence & Abuse Chairman Forst moved for \$1K, seconded
- 166 by School Board Rep. Heyman. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #21 for \$1K.
- 167 Article #22, Support the Community Action Program Chairman Forst moved for \$5K, seconded by Member
- 168 Bass. Vote: passed with one abstention, Budget Committee supports Article #22 for \$5K.
- Article #23, Support the Lakes Region Mental Health Center. Chairman Forst moved for \$7,500, seconded by
- 170 Member Bass. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #23 for \$7,500.
- 171 Article #24: Support the Gilmanton Snowmobile Association Chairman Forst moved for \$4K, seconded by
- 172 Member Bass. There was a discussion about the increase over last year. Vote: passed with three no votes,
- 173 Budget Committee supports Article #24 for \$4K.
- 174 Article #25, Support the Gilmanton Iron Works Private Library Chairman Forst moved for \$1K, seconded by
- 175 Member Bass. There was a discussion regarding what the money being asked for is used for. Vote: passed with
- one abstention, Budget Committee supports Article #25 for \$1K.
- 177 Article #26, Support Granite VNA formerly Central NH Visiting Nurses Association & Hospice Chairman Forst
- moved for \$7,600, seconded by Member Bass. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #26 for \$7,600.
- 179 Article #27, Support the Court-Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of NH Chairman Forst moved for \$1K,
- 180 seconded by Member Adams?. Vote: passed, Budget Committee supports Article #27 for \$1K.
- 181 Article #28, Support the Rocky Pond Association Milfoil Chairman Forst moved for \$1K, seconded by Member
- 182 Bass. Vote: passed with two no votes, Budget Committee supports Article #28 for \$1K.
- 183 Article #29, Support the Gilmanton July 4th Association Chairman Forst moved for \$5,500, seconded by
- 184 Member Bass. There was a discussion about how much the increase is over last year. Vote: passed with one no
- vote, Budget Committee supports Article #29 for \$5,500.
- 186 Estimate Revenues 2023. Discussion was held regarding the Selectmen recommended of \$2,117,032 from
- 187 revenue.
- 188 There was a discussion about a process and expectation on how and what would be the format for presenting
- the budget from the Town and School for the future.
- 190 MOTION: On a motion by Selectmen's Rep. Baiocchetti and seconded by Vice Chairman Kirby it was voted to
- 191 adjourn. (8-0)
