Local Resource Protection Priorities

## **Local Resource Protection Priorities**

The Regional Planning Commissions created the Local Resource Protection Priorities data layer in 1998-99 with funding from the Department of Environmental Services (DES) in order to support statewide land conservation efforts, such as LCHIP, and to improve the protection of valuable resources. DES and the Regional Planning Commissions initiated an update of this data in March, 2004. This update to the data layer will be made available to the public on the GRANIT website.

The Conservation Commission, with input from the Gilmanton Land Trust, reviewed and corrected the original data, and added new locations. The original data is listed first in the table on the next page followed by the new data.

## **Map Notes and Data Sources**

Please note that the maps included in this report, as well as additional ones, are also available at the Gilmanton Town Hall at a scale of 1 inch = 2000 feet.

Most of the data found in the following maps represents stock data sets obtained in 2002 from the NH GRANIT database as maintained by the Complex Systems Research Center (CSRC) at the University of New Hampshire (UNH). The New Hampshire Geographically Referenced Analysis and Information Transfer System (NH GRANIT) is a cooperative project to create, maintain, and make available a statewide geographic database serving the information needs of state, regional and local decision makers. A collaborative effort between the University of New Hampshire and the NH Office of Energy and Planning (OEP), the core GRANIT System is housed at the UNH Institute for the Study of Earth, Oceans, and Space in Durham. The GRANIT approach to a statewide GIS depends upon the cooperative efforts of a host of agencies, collaborating on various elements of database design and construction as well as application development.

NH GRANIT and CSRC maintain a continuing program to identify and correct any errors in these data. CSRC, the Town of Gilmanton and the cooperating agencies make no claim as to the validity or reliability or to any implied uses of these data.

#### **Data Source Details**

- Conservation Lands (2/2003) include stock GRANIT data as well as parcels digitized by the Lakes Region Planning Commission and SPNHF from town tax maps and surveys.
- Roads derived from NH DOT roads layer (5/2002) and USGS digital line graphs with corrections and updates identified by the Town of Gilmanton and digitized by SPNHF.
- Streams derived from stock GRANIT stream layer (1968) with corrections and updates as identified by the Town of Gilmanton.
- Watershed boundaries were compiled and automated by the Water Management Bureau of the Water Resources Division, and are based on watersheds originally delineated at a scale of 1:250,000 by the US Natural Resources Conservation Service. Last revision, February, 1994.
- Transmissivity quantifies the ability of an aquifer to transmit water, measured in feet squared per day. This data was automated from maps generated as part of a large study of groundwater resources in the state. The study was conducted under a cooperative agreement between the US Geological Survey and the NH Department of Environmental Services, Water Resources Division. Last revision, February, 2000.
- Public Drinking Water and Contamination Sites data is distributed by the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services. Last revision date, November, 2003.
- Groundwater Hazards Inventory, New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services. Last revision date, December, 2003.

- Surface Water data derived from USGS digital line graphs. Last revised, October, 1995.
- Land Cover data from satellite images acquired by the Landsat Thematic Mapper between 1990 and 1999 form the basis of the classification, augmented where possible by digital aerial photography, digital raster scans of USGS quadrangles, vector data layers archived by the GRANIT database, digital elevation models and field data collection. Last revision, December, 2001.
- National Wetland Inventory (NWI). Wetlands mapped by the US Fish and Wildlife Service based on aerial photography. Last revision, Summer, 2001.
- REPP (Regional Environmental Protection Priorities) data. In 1998, Gilmanton joined with other Lakes Region communities in a project to identify important cultural and natural resource priorities. This list was updated in 2004. Water resource priorities from this list have been included on the Drinking Water Resources map. Please see Appendix E for a complete listing.
