- 1. Approve meeting minutes 10/5/2021
 - 1. Lori motions to approve, approved 7-0
- 2. Action Items Updates
 - 1. Town Forester (Ron Klemarczyk) contact Lori
 - 1. Ron K is scheduled to attend our December meeting prepare questions
 - 1. Action Item: Inquire about rates for his service? → Lori
 - 2. Do we also have access to a County Forester?
 - 3. Does he have volunteers to help with bridge building?
 - 2. Gilmanton Land Trust (GLT) contact Lori
 - 1. Fuzz Freese is our GLT liaison and is present today
 - 3. Joe Urner Updates Baldwins
 - 1. The trail is cleared and blazed
 - 2. We still need a map holder and bridges for stream crossing
 - Action Item: Schedule final work day to install temporary bridges for stream crossings → Lori
 - 2. Action Item: Acquire planks and wood for bridges → Thomie
 - 4. Joe Urner Map Soren

- 1. The map is drafted and accepting feedback (consistent labels, more road prominence, matching labels to the key)
- 2. Action Item: Complete map for distribution by the end of the calendar year 2021 → Soren
- 5. Public Notice Megan and Lori
 - 1. Created a list of 8-10 places to post pictures, maps, general information
- 3. Trail planning
 - 1. Joe Urner: final tasks
 - 1. Final workday to install bridges
 - 2. Address parking situation: currently parking is on the grass and this will continue to be mowed
 - 1. Marking the parking lot with logs for indication
 - 2. Eventually there will be a kiosk and sign pointing folks to the trail
 - 3. Action Item: Request guidance from GCC regarding parking → Lori
 - 2. Cogswell: next steps
 - 1. Wet spots, blazing, and signage need to be addressed
 - 2. Scoping interesting features to highlight in future trail building
- 4. Other business
 - 1. Conservation Lands Soren
 - 1. Created a draft of all Town Conservation Lands (town owned and not) within a 1 mile radius of the town, needs feedback on content
- 5. Meeting with Gilmanton Snowmobile Association
 - 1. When are the snowmobile trails closed?
 - 1. Gates are shut by the end of the season (April) and the trails are open to walking and hiking
 - 2. Are there many gates?
 - 1. GSA has moved towards chains and landowners want them closed in the off-season
 - 3. Are snowmobile trails on private property open to summer hiking access?
 - 1. Chrough current use laws, hikers are protected as long as the trails are open to recreational use
 - 2. If the land isn't posted, all lands are open to walking
 - 1. Work with the owners for trail building and publication
 - 4. Can bridges or boardwalks be built to cross wet spots at Cogswell?
 - 1. Ideally the hiking trail would cross at a different spot than the snowmobile trail due to the groomer and emergency forestry truck
 - 5. Questions about Cogswell property
 - 1. Would color-coded trail signs and blazes interfere with snowmobilers?
 - 1. No this is not bothersome

- 2. Denoting the trails as multi-use is necessary to make hikers aware of potential snowmobiles and prevent incident
- 2. Is the Skantze tract part of the GSA system?
 - 1. No, this may have been logging access at one point
- 3. What are the white blazes on parts of the trail?
 - 1. Reflectors for night snowmobiling and for snowstorm visibility, they can be removed
- 4. Who can be contacted about the blazing plan?
 - 1. GSA administrator Brian Lamarsh makes the maps
- 5. Does GSA have volunteers?
 - 1. Yes, events are posted to Facebook or word of mouth
 - 1. Building bridges on the Bingham trail and Meetinghouse trail are upcoming events
 - 2. Interested people can be shared between GSA and trails committee
- 6. Are GSA trails friendly to cross-country skiers?
 - 1. Yes, trails are open to nordic skiing, walking, hiking, and are multi-use recreational trails
- 7. Can we denote cross-country skiing and snowmobile trails in the Gilmanton Trail Guide?
 - 1. Yes, permission is needed from landowners to publish their property
- 6. December Meeting Items
 - 1. Create master plans for work on Cogswell and Jones Farm properties
 - 2. Create procedure for reimbursement of the subcommittee
 - 1. Identify source of funding for materials needed for trail building and maintenance
