TRANSFER STATION
RE-OPENING PLAN

The following is a description of our plan to gradually get back to “normal”:

1. **Effective, Saturday, June 20, 2020**, recycling will resume on weekends during normal business hours. As a reminder, recycling is also available on Wednesdays during normal business hours.
2. Residents during their visit at the Transfer Station, are recommended to continue adhering to CDC and State of NH Public Health Guidelines, in particular as it relates to social distancing. - Ground markings have been instituted to facilitate compliance with COVID-19 social distancing guidelines.
3. Even more so now than at any other given time, we highly encourage you to get yourself familiar with recycling rules in order to minimize/eliminate risk of staff contamination due to necessary re-sorting of recycling materials. If you are not sure whether/how to recycle any item, please ask the staff.
4. **Sort at home**, this speeds up time for you and your neighbor waiting behind you.
5. Please note that **all waxed paper/cardboard materials are no longer recyclable** items and should be disposed of in your regular trash
 - a. Waxed cardboard is corrugated (multi-layered) cardboard that is lined with polyethylene to prevent it from getting soggy. This material is designed to be refrigerated or frozen. If you can see or feel waxy residue when you scrape a box with your fingernail, it is waxed.
 - b. Examples (not an exhaustive list) are: milk/juice/ containers, beer/soda/drinks pack holders, cereal containers, frozen food etc...
6. Personal protective equipment (“PPE”) such as facemasks and gloves, **is for regular trash and not for recycling**. Even if it is plastic or rubber, it is contaminated. It is regular trash and not recyclable. **Put your PPE in a secure and tight garbage bag**. Put it out with the regular trash for collection
7. The “swap” room remains close until further notice. Please refrain from leaving items in front of the room

We thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation – working together, we hope to have a safe and healthy re-opening to the public.
